### Inform Yourself Contact:

- 1. Call Your Emergency Management Office, Red Cross, & Redhawk survival Institute for information and Survival kits
- 2. Find out which disasters could occur in your area.
- 3. Learn your community's evacuation routes and shelters.
- 4. Ask about special assistance for elderly or disabled persons.
- 5. Ask your workplace about emergency plans.
- 6. Ask about your children's school or day care center's emergency plan.

## Create A Home Emergency Plan:

- Meet with household members. Discuss with children the types of emergencies such as fire, severe weather, earthquakes...
- Discuss what to do about power outages and personal injuries.
- 3. Know how to turn off the utilities at main switches ei; gas, hydro
- 4. Post emergency telephone #'s.
- 5. Teach children how and when to call 911, police, and fire.
- Instruct household members to turn on the radio for emergency information.
- Pick one out-of-town friend or relative to call if separated by disaster (it is often easier to call out-of-town than within the affected area).
- 8. Teach children how to make long distance telephone calls.
- 9. Pick two meeting places.
  - At home or near home in case of a fire.
- A place outside your neighbourhood in case you cannot return home after a disaster. Take a Basic First Aid and CPR Class.
  - Practice family fire drill and evacuation plans
  - Practice STOP, DROP & ROLL (should clothes catch on fire)

### Guidelines For Pets:

- 1. Gathering pet supplies.
  - Ensuring your pet has proper ID and up-to-date veterinarian records.
    - 3. Providing a pet carrier and leash
